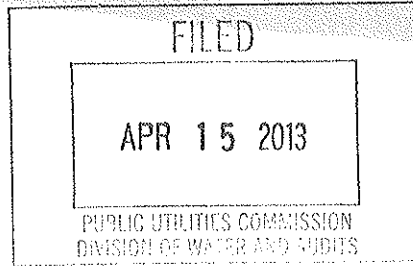

Purpose:

This advice letter filing requests recovery of the Division of Ratepayer Advocates' ("DRA") General Audit costs as authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) in Application ("A.") 10-07-007. Also, California seeks recovery of two intervenor compensation awards. One awarded to the National Consumer Law Center ("NCLC") by Decision ("D.")12-04-040 for its contributions to D.11-05-004. The other to The Utility Reform Network ("TURN") by D.12-09-016 for its contributions to D.11-10-034.

Background:

Partial Settlement Agreement

On July 28, 2011, DRA, TURN, and California American Water executed and filed with the Commission a Partial Settlement Agreement on revenue requirement issues in A.10-07-007. The Commission adopted the Partial Settlement Agreement in D.12-06-016. Section 11.16 of the Partial Settlement Agreement states that:

DRA and California American Water agree that California American Water will file an advice letter to establish a customer surcharge to recover expenditures incurred by the Commission's Water Branch of DRA on Personal Service Contract 10PS5881. After the Commission issues a final decision in A.10-07-007, DRA will report the balance incurred at that time.¹

California American Water issued four audit cost payments – totaling \$139,437.09 – on January 19, 2011 and one payment – totaling \$60,000.00 – on October 31, 2011, for a grand total of \$199,437.09.

Intervenor Compensation Awarded to NCLC

In D.12-04-040, the Commission awarded NCLC \$22,485.80 and order the following:

Within 30 days of the effective date of this decision, Golden State Water Company, California Water Service Company, Park Water Company, Suburban Water Systems, San Jose Water Company, Great Oaks Water Company, Valencia Water Company, San Gabriel Valley Water Company, and Apple Valley Ranchos Water Company shall pay claimant the total award. We direct [the above-mentioned utilities] to allocate payment responsibility among [themselves], based on their California-jurisdictional water revenues for the 2008 calendar year, to reflect the year in which the proceeding was primarily litigated. Payment of the award shall include interest at the rate earned on prime, three-month commercial paper as reported in Federal Reserve Statistical Release H.15, beginning September 24, 2011 the 75th day after the filing of claimant's request, and continuing until full payment is made.²

While D.12-04-040 makes no mention of California American Water, a footnote to Ordering Paragraph 2 states that “[t]o avoid the imposition of an administrative burden of allocating very small shares of the award to the smaller entities, **we allocate responsibility of payment of the award to the Class A water companies.**”³ California American Water is a Class A water company as it serves more than 10,000 customers. Additionally, D.11-05-004 – the decision which NCLC contributed to – orders California American Water to comply with several directives issued in that decision. The directives in D.11-05-004, the footnote to Ordering Paragraph 2 of D.12-04-040, as well as California American Water's participation in Phase 2 of the Conservation Policies OII (I.07-01-022) indicate that the omission of California American Water from D.12-04-040 is merely a mistake.

On May 17, 2012, California American Water issued a payment – which included interest – of \$2,460.32 to NCLC for its share of the award.

Intervenor Compensation Awarded to TURN

In D.12-09-016, the Commission awarded TURN \$8,921.00 for its contributions to D.11-10-034 and ordered the following:

Consumer Federation of California is awarded \$8,921.00 as compensation for its substantial contributions to Decision 12-09-016.

Within 30 days of the effective date of this decision, San Jose Water Company, California Water Service Company, Golden State Water Company, California-American Water Company, Valencia Water Company, Park Water Company, Suburban Water Company, San Gabriel Valley Water Company, and Great Oaks Water Company, shall pay [TURN] their respective shares of the award. We direct [the utilities] to allocate payment responsibility among themselves based on their California-jurisdictional revenues for the 2010 calendar year, to reflect the year in which the proceeding was primarily litigated. Payment of the award shall include interest at the rate earned on prime, three-month commercial paper as reported in Federal Reserve Statistical Release H.15, beginning March 5, 2012, the 75th day after the filing of claimant's request, and continuing until full payment is made.⁴

On October 3, 2012, California American Water issued a payment – which included interest – of \$1,077.19 to TURN for its share of the award.

Request:

California American Water requests to implement a meter surcharge on all classes of customers. The amount to be recovered includes \$199,437.09 for the General Audit Costs, \$1,077.19 for a payment to NCLC, and \$2,460.32 for a payment to TURN, for a total recovery of \$202,974.60. California American Water was compelled to make these payments both by Commission⁵ and statutory directives.⁶

The actions requested in this advice letter are not now the subject of any formal filings with the Commission, including a formal complaint, nor action in any court of law.

This filing will not cause the withdrawal of service, nor conflict with other schedules or rules.

Tier Designation:

This advice letter is submitted with a Tier 2 designation.

Effective Date:

California American Water requests that the tariffs discussed above, be made effective May 15, 2013.

In accordance with Section 4.3 of General Order 96-B, a copy of this advice letter has been served upon all interested and affected parties as shown in Exhibit A.

Protests and Responses:

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter.

A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.)

8. Subject to the approval of the Utility, any change in the location or construction of the fire protection service as may be requested by public authority or the customer will be made by the Utility following payment to the Utility of the entire cost of such change.
9. Any unauthorized use of water other than fire protection purposes, charges shall be made therefore, at the regular established rate for general metered service, without liability to the Utility.
10. All bills are subject to the reimbursement fee set forth on Schedule No. U.F.
11. A Surcharge is included on each bill to collect franchise taxes and/or business license fees paid to various municipalities. The amount collected is based on a percentage of gross revenues of each bill. The percentage is 2% to City of San Diego and the City of Imperial Beach.
12. Per Advice Letter 974, a surcharge is applied to each bill to offset increases in purchased water costs imposed by the City of San Diego effective March 1, 2011.
