

**Service your septic system.** Have your septic tank pumped and septic system inspected regularly usually every 3-5 years.

Select non- or less toxic household cleaning **products.** Use phosphate-free detergents.



## Clean up after your pets. Animal waste may contain harmful organisms such as Giardia, Salmonella and E. coli.

Limit the use of fertilizers and avoid pesticides. Consider natural alternatives.



**Properly dispose of** household chemicals.

Never pour chemicals or oil down the drain, toilet, storm drains or on the ground. Dispose of pharmaceuticals, vehicle batteries, household chemicals, oils, and paints at proper waste collection sites.

**Prevent chemicals from reaching storm** drains. Sweep sidewalks and driveways instead of using a hose. Direct downspouts onto lawns and away from paved surfaces (or add a rain barrel to save water for later use).

**Buffer streams.** 

Have a stream on your property? Provide a natural buffer of native trees, shrubs and plants along its banks to filter storm water runoff. Plant grass on the bare spots in your yard.
